Through the identification of various themes and the establishment of outcomes, the Quilpie Shire Community Plan 2021 defines the future for the Shire. The plan documents the vision of the community for the future, as well as the strategies required to achieve that vision.

The Quilpie Shire Community Plan 2021 covers the Quilpie Shire Local Government area. The unique characteristics of the communities that make up the Shire each deliver individual strengths to the overall identity of the Shire.

Through consultation with the community, and the identification of various themes, community outcome areas have been determined. Delivery within the outcome areas will ensure the vision, as determined by the community, will ensue. The outcome areas contain priorities and goals which are considered essential for the Vision to be realised.

Community Plan Development

- Integrated Environmental Management System

Segmentation of Community Stakeholders was undertaken to ensure all elements of the community were included in the process.

Individual interviews were also undertaken to ensure representation of specific issues relating to:

Through the process of community consultation and interviews together with robust discussion and identification of areas of concern for the future of the Shire, a wide range of suggestions and opinions were collected. These enabled clear identification of specific themes.

Validation of identified themes was undertaken using repeat consultation forums in each of the five locations together with further interviews with specific interest groups.

An overall Vision Statement was developed and validated through presentation with council and community.

The Vision for the Quilpie Shire acknowledges what is valued by the community today, and what is desired to ensure the community prospers, experiences an appropriate level of growth, improves vital services and maintains the treasured lifestyle.

Making it Work through **Ongoing Community Participation**

Continued community engagement is vital to the ongoing success of the Community Plan. Throughout the process of consultation for the Community Plan, participants identified both a need and a desire for ongoing engagement.

To be successful in the implementation of the Community Plan, it has been recognised that ongoing support and participation across all five communities is essential. Throughout the process of consultation for the development of the Community Plan, areas for operational action were identified throughout the Shire. It was determined that the development and continuous improvement of a robust Community Engagement framework would ensure opportunities for participation by the community were maximised. Additionally, areas of communication would be identified ensuring an informed community.

The communities of Quilpie Shire recognise the value of ongoing active participation to ensue the vision is realised. The future is ours......



History of Community

A colourful history of strength and persistence permeates the culture and characters of Quilpie Shire.

In 1878, famous cattle drover, Patsy Durack said "Cattle Kings ye call us, then we are Kings in Grass Castles that may be blown away upon a puff of wind." This sums up the pioneering spirit and tentative hold on the land. Today the theme 'Kings in Grass Castles' can be found throughout the Shire.

Each of the five locations which make up Quilpie Shire have had an enormous influence on the community and lifestyle experienced today. Each sent sons to war to fight for our great nation. Each contributed to the establishment of the State of Queensland. Each has and continues to contribute to the economic prosperity of the State of Queensland and the Nation.

There are stories of the first settlers; family names such as Tully, Durack and Costello. Stories of struggles of flood, drought and hardship of isolation. Stories of prosperity through opal mining and grazing.

Our future is bright with untold opportunity.



Quilpie

Population: 654

Quilpie is the service centre for the shire, which covers 67,482 square kilometres. It has all the necessities and many luxuries expected by the locals and visitors. Around the world, Quilpie is known as the home of the boulder opal. However, there is much more to this location. The artistic talents of local artists, both established and emerging are rich. Inspiration is drawn from the beautiful surrounds enjoyed by visitors and locals.

Adavale

Population: 25

Toward the end of the 19th Century, Adavale was one of the most important towns in western Queensland with steady trade for the hotels and businesses as a result of the activity at the nearby opal fields. Originally the railway was planned for Adavale, however a government decision to change the planned railway line route saw Quilpie become the hub. Rich with history, Adavale has some of the most beautiful scenery in the Shire.

Cheepie

Population: 1

As a change station for Cobb & Co, Cheepie was fundamental to the success of the Shire during its years of establishment. At its peak, Cheepie had a police station, blacksmith, railway station, tent boarding houses, butcher shop, bakery and two organic vegetable gardens. Cheepie was the hub for transport and communications at the turn of the century.







Eromanga

Population: 45

Eromanga has been known for many years as the furthest town from the ocean in Australia, as well as for producing around 1.5million barrels of oil per year. The early history of Eromanga is rich and its story is well told at the Object Theatre and Rustic Outdoor Machinery Museum. Today, Eromanga is vital to the history of the nation as the newest paleontological frontier in Queensland. Eromanga is home to some of the newest specimens.



Toompine

Population: 2

The sign at this old Cobb & Co staging post says it all: Toompine – the pub with no town. The outback pub at Toompine is over 100 years old. There are excellent opportunities for fishing and yabbying not far from the hotel.

A fully functioning community needs to be a fully serviced community. The quality and access to education and health services needs to be in line with metropolitan areas if the wellbeing of communities is to be maintained.

The communities of Quilpie Shire value their older residents. It is expected that residents of the Quilpie communities are able to transition to retirement while still maintaining the lifestyle they have enjoyed throughout their lives. Accessibility and affordability of services such as health care and transport for our aging population and people with disabilities is critical.

Children and youth in isolated communities such as those in the Quilpie Shire should not be penalised due to location. It is imperative that the best opportunities and full access to education and learning programs be offered.

The residents of the communities of the Quilpie Shire have different needs and desires in terms of housing. Housing availability is a concern for the community. A variety of housing options should be available to current residents and for those wishing to make the Quilpie Shire their home. A 'one size fits all' solution is not in line with maintaining a lifestyle for which we are entitled. Additionally, cost should not prohibit the availability of attractive and suitable housing.

Our Natural Environment

The natural environment and landscape is key to our lifestyle. We have valuable natural resources unique in many ways to our area. These include opals, oil and an abundance of artesian water.

The discovery and exploitation of artesian water enabled previously barren lands to be taken up, stocked and settled. This permitted more secure and intensive stocking, enabled stock to travel along watered stock routes rather than river courses, facilitated stock breeding and reduced costs associated with the pastoral business. The artesian water supply of a century ago is part of who we are.

Of all the opal varieties, the Quilpie shire is famous for the Boulder opal. This is found as thin veins occupying cracks and cavities in nodules of siliceous concretionary ironstone, which occur in the beds of sandstone at varying depths. The boulders can vary between spherical or elongated and can be a few inches to more than two meters in length.

The Eromanga oil and gas basin is known for producing a staggering million and a half barrels of oil each year. Santos has been involved in exploration of this area since 1962. Today, the Cooper/Eromanga Basin is the largest onshore resource exploration project with an active exploration program maintained.

The recent discovery of two titanosaur dinosaurs which are estimated to have been at least 26 meters in total body length are of increasing interest and vital to the success of our future. Titanosaurs were among the largest living animals of all time. The Palaeontology is of significant importance to the future success and opportunities of the Quilpie Shire.

The Quilpie Shire is rich with natural landscape wonders such as Mariala National Park, Hellhole National Park and Idalia National Park. These National Parks are home to treasured wildlife and fauna. We celebrate our natural environment through our artistic contributions.
