#### FROM THE CEO DESK FEBRUARY 2019

Council held its Ordinary Meeting on Friday 15 February 2019. As is customary all Councillors provided an overview of activities they have undertaken since the last Council meeting.

In addition to a wide range of meetings and activities attended by Councillors during the month, all Councillors met with Mr Robert Prestipino (Vital Places) together with Department of State Development representatives Mr John Bird and Mrs Jody Dare in relation to the Wellspring project.

Council has been allocated \$1.09 million under the Works for Queensland 2019/2021 program. Council resolved to undertake the following works under the program:

John Waugh Park exclusion fencing \$140,000;

- Eromanga Tennis/Multi-purpose court \$120,000;
- Road Infrastructure \$480,000;
- Ricky Milosevic Memorial \$130,000;
- Grid renewals \$100,000; and
- Concrete footpaths Quilpie \$120,000.

Council were provided with information on the options available to rectify the ongoing issues being experienced with the Eromanga television transmission. A decision on this matter will be made at the March Council meeting. Also to be considered at the March meeting is options for Council to coordinate a container exchange scheme for the shire.

Council approved the request received from the Adavale Sports & Recreation Inc. Committee to sponsor the cost of the Ambulance Service to be present at the 2019 Stockman's Challenge, Rodeo, Gymkhana and Bikekhana.

It is a requirement under s167 of the Local Government Regulation 2012 that a local government must prepare and adopt a long-term asset management plan. As such, Council reviewed and adopted the updated Water Supply Services Asset Management Plan and Sewerage Services Asset Management Plan.

An application has been lodged for a new bore under the 2019/2021 Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program (LGGSP). Council ratified a second application for the South West Regional Road and Transport Group for funding the Regional Asset Management Strategy.

Council has been advised that Real Energy has made application for a Petroleum Pipeline Licence (PPL) to the Department of Natural Resources, Mines and Energy. Real Energy intends to construct a raw gas transmission pipeline from its Windorah Gas Project into the Santos operated PL141 where it will tie in to the existing Mt Howitt facility. The proposed pipeline will be approximately 15km in length, and lie entirely within the "Plevna Downs" property.

Cr Mackenzie left the meeting while this matter was discussed and voted upon where it was resolved that no submission on the application would be made.

Amnesty International have requested that Council give consideration to adopting a Refugee Community Sponsorship Program.

Council supported the adoption of a Refugee Community Sponsorship Program and will write to Federal members requesting that they:

Adopt a more affordable visa structure for the Community Support Program (CSP) to make it more affordable to sponsors, including community organisations, families and businesses;

- Make the cap on the CSP additional to our current humanitarian intake, in order to recognize the generosity of our communities and businesses, rather than shifting both the costs and responsibilities to them;
- Provide adequate support and services to assist with resettlement and community integration; and
- Ensure people in need of protection are prioritised to settle in Australia.

Regional Development Australia Darling Downs and South West (RDA DDSW) has invited Council to nominate one key issue and one reserve issue to be discussed and progressed at the upcoming "Five Issues Forum" being held in Cunnamulla on 07 March 2019. The forum will be attended by representatives from local, state and federal government together with other relevant stakeholders for the purpose of nominating priorities for the region. Council nominated population decline and zonal tax rebates as key issues.

Following requests for deputations to various ministerial representatives, Quilpie Shire Council has been invited to meet with Deputy Prime Minister Hon Michael McCormack MP, Federal Member for Maranoa and Minister for Agriculture and Water Resources, Hon David Littleproud MP and the Minister for Energy Hon. Angus Taylor MP on a range of issues. Crs Mackenzie, Hewson and Hall were authorised to attend the meetings in Canberra.

As usual a range of other administrative matters were also discussed. The full minutes of the most recent and previous meetings are available on Council's website at www.quilpie.qld.gov.au (About Council / Meetings).

I am happy to meet with anyone that would like further information on any meeting outcomes. Members of the community are also reminded that all Councillors are happy to speak with you on any issue.



The NDIS also provides people with disability, their family and carers with information and referrals to existing support services in the community.




By 2019, the NDIS will support about 460,000 Australians with disability.







## Can I access the NDIS?
