






WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

OFFICE OF THE INFORMATION COMMISSIONER QUEENSLAND

In late 2018, Council was required to participate in a self-assessment of progress implementing the Right To Information Act 2009 (Qld) and Information Privacy Act 2009 (Qld). This assessment formed part of the "10 years on — Queensland government agencies' self-assessment of their compliance with the Right to Information Act 2009 and the Information Privacy Act 2009 " and was tabled in the Legislative Assembly on 13 June 2019. Quilpie Shire Council's score card read as follows:

GENERAL INFORMATION

In June there has been positive cooperation between services. I met with the South West Hospital and Health Services Primary and Community Care Coordinator as there has been confusion over support given to people under 65, as some clients do not meet the NDIA criteria. Under the Queensland Community Care Program people with disabilities that do not meet the NDIA criteria are entitled to a range of services including, home care, home maintenance and small home modifications. We have set up a referral pathway between the NDIS Coordinator and QCC which to date is working effectively.

The lack of Mental Health services is an ongoing problem, as there are no visiting Physiologists with either Government or non-Government organisations, and won't be for the foreseeable future. I have made contact with Family Connect (Lifeline) Charleville as their Family Councilors visit fortnightly. I have had 2 families that have requested assistance and with written consent I have been able to refer them to Family Connect Charleville.

The first planning day for a Client will take place in July. The process has taken 147 days from gaining access to the NDIS to the actual Plan meeting date. I have been working with clients in pre-planning meetings to ensure they know what their future goals might be, to be able to voice how their disability affects their life, budgeting to continue their supports that are already in place as well as additional supports that are part of their goals. I will be able to attend the planning meeting in July as an advocate and support person for the client as they have requested my presence.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Capacity building – Tourism Manager attended the Quilpie Show and Rodeo meeting in June to meet the committee and understand the event. Manager will be working with representatives to assist with the marketing of the event including advertising that Council assist with each year.

Geocaching meeting – An information session has been organized for August 2019. Community members will be invited to come along and learn about how they can place a geocache throughout Quilpie Shire. This information session will be presented by Kerry Lloyd who is based in Blackall. Kerry is assisting in organizing a Geocaching event in early October in Blackall. This event is expected to attract 100's of people to the Blackall region.

Bash Break on Brolga — Saturday 13 July 2019. This is a single day event identified to provide opportunities for local business and organisations to raise funds and/or increase patronage to their business. It is designed for Bash attendees. Shearing demos and music will also be in the street. The Visitor Information Centre will have extended hours for the entire weekend, with two staff on to support the numbers anticipated as a trial for 2019. The campaign will focus on social media and surrounding Visitor Information Centre's for travelers who are heading through.

Local Photography Competition – the Visitor Information Centre staff have recently promoted their annual photographic exhibition. There are four categories in 2019;

- Cover of a magazine (celebrating year of the outback)
- Your favourite moment
- Mother nature at her best
- Anything goes

Images need to be provided to the centre by 16 July with the official opening on the 19 July.

Tourism and Events Queensland (TEQ) – TEQ recently held their board meeting in Charleville (25 June 2019). They hosted a meet and greet on Monday 24 June; this was a great opportunity to meet with board members and surrounding tourism counterparts. TEQ staff and two board members then headed to Eromanga for the evening to experience the ENHM. They stopped in at Quilpie on the way through for a short visit and spent time at Opal Altar, Fossicking Area and The Lake.

Caravan and Camping Show Brisbane – Tourism Manager recently attended the show in Brisbane (4 – 10 June). This was a busy show for people heading to the South West (Birdsville). Patrons to this show are different to Sydney due to their knowledge of Queensland. The next show Quilpie will be attending is Toowoomba 4x4 on behalf of Natural Sciences Loop and Outback Queensland Tourism Association.

Tourism and Events Queensland – Tourism Manager met with representatives at TEQ while in Brisbane for the Caravan and Camping Show. This was an opportunity to meet representatives and build relationships. Departments included:
