This report is to provide an overview of activities carried out by the Engineering Services Department in October 2019.

ROADS

RMPC

Gravel has been carted on the Quilpie-Thargomindah road south of Toompine in preparation for shoulder grading works. Limited RMPC works are underway as the constructions crews are working on other project works.

TIDS

Quilpie-Adavale Red Road works have continued throughout the month between chainages 54.35 and 58.5kms. Bitumen sealing works to be carried out by Colas are programmed for 17 November 2019.

The remaining areas for construction for the rest of the financial year have now had designs approved.

Shire Roads Maintenance

Works have been carried out on Wareo Road adjacent to Flood Damage works. Some minor patching and signage works have been carried out.

Flood Damage

Works are nearing completion on Wareo Road. Initial planning work has been carried out for Trinidad Road. Some transport of gravel to site has commenced.

Proterra's project manager Cameron Mocke has been working with Council staff to gain local knowledge and he has been marking the works boundaries on the various sites.

Tenders for the four works packages to be delivered by Contractors have closed. The tenders were to be discussed by Council on 5 November 2019 at a special meeting of Council.

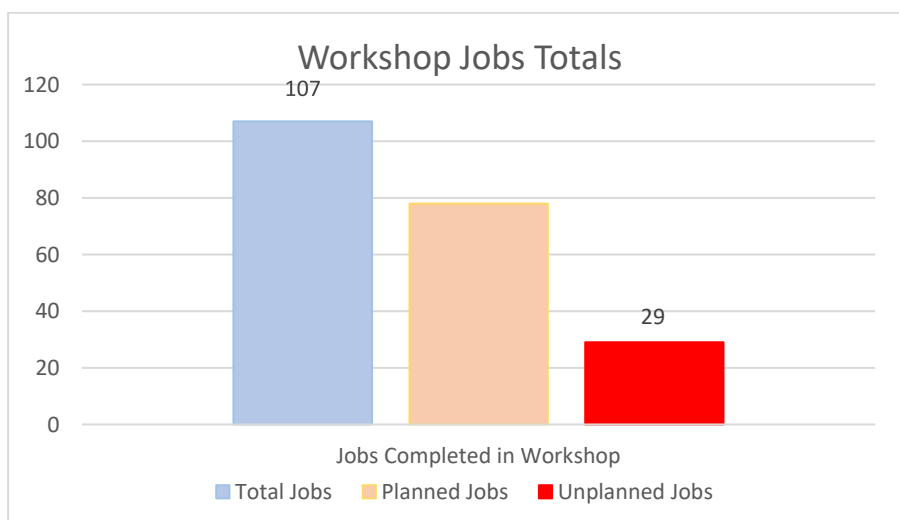

GENERAL INFORMATION

During October 2 new participants were approved in the NDIS Program, 1 has already had their plan approved and we are currently setting up their budget supports. My role as their support coordinator is to provide guidance and organize their supports. The second participant will have their planning meeting in early November. I have also had 2 children referred for NDIS access from Quilpie State College, so I am working with these parents to collect their evidence and assist them in navigating the different pathways.

The ongoing lack of Allied Health services is a continuing problem with no Speech Pathologist at either Queensland Health or visiting CWAATSICH, although Vital Health does telehealth consultations. I do not agree that telehealth is an appropriate option for first time assessments. The NDIS participants are also being charged the full amount as listed in the NDIS Service Provider Price guide whether it is face to face or telehealth. I will be trying to negotiate a lower price for telehealth consultations for future service agreements.

I attended the Community Advisory Network Chair's Forum in the last week of October, where I presented in my role as NDIS Coordinator with a question and answer session which was very successful.
