RMPC

Shoulder grading work on the Diamantina Development Road (93A) near the Red Road (7101) intersection is essentially complete.

Some wet weather grading was carried out on the Quilpie – Adavale Red Road (7101) at the Southern end.

Patching works have been carried out on the Cooper Development Road (79A) and on the Quilpie – Thargomindah Road (7003)

Shire Roads Maintenance

Some emergent repair works have been carried out throughout the Shire by contractors and Council staff. Some roads have ben Congie, Corowa, Trinidad, Adavale-Charleville, Adavale Black Road, Big Creek, Old Charleville Road, and Tobermory Roads.

Flood Damage Repairs

Adavale Plant Hire is currently working on Trinidad Road (28). S. Travers is working on Adavale – Charleville Road (70). S. Bowen is working on Big Creek (17) and Humeburn Road (18).

MAIN ROADS TIDS

The second project for 2019-2020 on the Quilpie-Adavale Red Road (7101) was sealed on the 26th-27th March 2020 from 66.4km - 71.0km. Work is currently continuing on a third section from 51.2km – 54.7km.

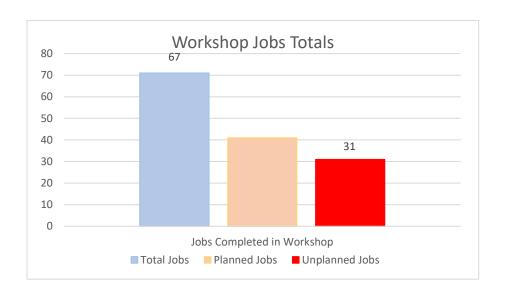

INTERAGENCY MEETING

An Interagency Meeting was held on 17th March 2020 and was well attended with numerous representatives from Quilpie agencies and Mental Health Services / Service Providers in Charleville.

Discussion centred around services offered in Quilpie and how co-ordination of the services could be improved to ensure clients within our community are receiving the best care possible.

CAN (COMMUNITY ADVISORY NETWORK) / SOUTH WEST HOSPITAL & HEALTH SERVICE

The Quilpie Community Advisory Network (CAN) has not yet re-scheduled the first meeting for 2020. The meeting which was due to be held on 25th February was postponed due to weather conditions / flooding. Due to the current COVID-19 situation, it is envisaged the next meeting will be held via zoom / teleconference.

RADF (REGIONAL ARTS DEVELOPMENT FUND)

In response to the impact of COVID-19, there have been several changes / updates relating to the delivery of the RADF Program.

2020-21 RADF Program

The date for funding applications is now extended from 2 April 2020 to 30 April 2020.

2019-20 RADF Program

Arts Queensland have advised that they are aware due to the current circumstances there may be significant changes to the current RADF Program and are willing to consider variances to Programs or

Project Delivery to achieve the Program objectives and support the continued employment of artists and arts workers in our regions.

QCWA – LEASE OF BUILDING TO QUILPIE SHIRE COUNCIL

The current Lease Agreement between Queensland Country Women's Association and Quilpie Shire Council is due to expire on 5th May 2020. The current Lease Agreement contains an option in *Item 4* – *Term of Lease* to extend the current Agreement for a further two (2) years. I have written to the QCWA advising of Council's desire to exercise this option.

QUILPIE DIGGERS RACE CLUB

Correspondence was received from Lyn Barnes on behalf of Quilpie Diggers Race Club thanking Council for agreeing to purchase the naming rights for the 2020 Quilpie Cup. QRDC has been advised by Racing Queensland that the May race meeting at Bulloo Park which was to host the first round of the TAB Racing Queensland Battle of the Bush Series will now take place at the designated clubs of either Charleville or Roma due to the current COVID-19 pandemic. QDRC will update all sponsors as soon as further information comes to hand from Racing Queensland.

CLOSURE OF FACILITIES / CANCELLATION OF EVENTS

Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, all community events and activities planned to be held in Quilpie during 2020 are now either cancelled or postponed until further advice has been received from the State and Federal Governments that the current social distancing restrictions are lifted.

The beginning of March started with assisting a Parent to access the Early Childhood Intervention (ECEI) for 2 children, the access phone call and then the referrals to the appropriate providers.

I have been working with another family to submit a change of circumstance for their child, which has been very complex.

Allied Health Services have utilised Bicentennial Park to continue client services (with approval from the Federal Government Covid 19 Hotline) due to the social distancing rules in place. If further restrictions were to be put in place services would have to be delivered via Skype or FaceTime. In preparation, I have commenced assisting clients to download skype to their PC's and IPads. Unfortunately, there are still challenges for some in relation to literacy issues and no access to technology. I have contacted the NDIS to see if it is possible for these participants to be able to spend money out of their plan for tablets / technology. At this stage I have not had a response. I do have access to an IPad that I have set up for 1 participant to use.

I attended the Interagency Meeting on the 17th March. It was a very positive meeting with many Mental Health practitioners in attendance, giving an insight as to what they all do and when they visit Quilpie.

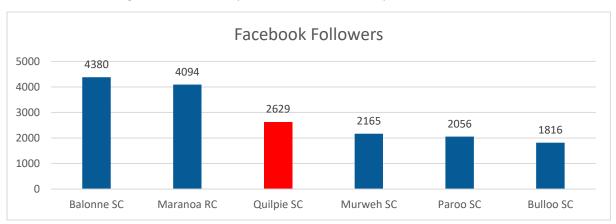

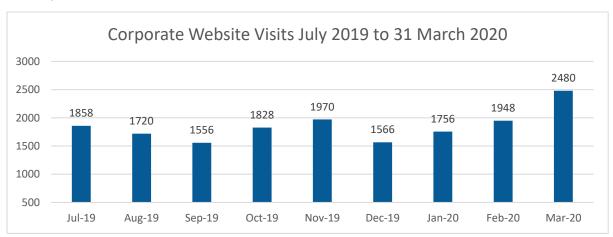

GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>Economic Development and Tourism Strategy:</u> The draft Outback Horizon 2024: Quilpie Shire Economic Development and Tourism Strategy – A roadmap for promoting prosperity will be presented in a separate decision report.

Quilpie Shire Visitor Guide: A new Quilpie visitor guide is currently in development. It have a new look and feel, focusing on imagery to tell the story while ensuring practical information is still provided for the traveler. It was expected to be delivered by end of April, however this will be pushed back until later in 2020.

<u>Natural Sciences Loop:</u> Tourism officers from each shire have been working together to develop new initiatives for the Loop during this period. One concept is to virtual tour/s of the Loop to share with visitors to inspire them to choose the Loop to visit once out of COVID-19 period. This will involve collecting new images using a 360degree camera. This can also be used to promote Quilpie Shire as well.

<u>Virtual Reality product development:</u> The VIC team have been working to develop a Virtual Reality night experience product. It will involve creation of a 20minute experience that will be based at the rear of the VIC. A separate decision report will be provided that will outline the storyline for this project.

The VIC team are also working on a secondary "Virtual Reality" VR experience for the VIC. This project will include a professionally filmed 360 degree 3-5min film, shot in the region with our choice of subject. This project will also include installation of VR headsets (x2) that will become property of the VIC and a 360degree camera so the VIC team can create extra content (including training and support).

<u>Podcasts:</u> The popularity of podcasts by the public have identified the opportunity to create Podcasts that could assist in promotion of the Shire. These have been in development for implementation in late 2020. The project will allow visitors to download prior to travel, or while travelling and initially focus on all entry points and communities within the Shire. The podcasts will feature local people telling life of the past, but also what to see today.

<u>Redevelopments</u>: The VIC, Museum and Gallery major internal works have been completed. The only outstanding works for completion is the external painting of the complex. Internal works include internal paint of the buildings, new tracking (to include all walls included curved walls), new brochure and merchandise displays. The team are currently resetting the local history museum and will be sparkling when we are in a position to reopen!
