ROADS

RMPC

Work has continued on shoulder grading on the Cooper Developmental Road (79A) South West of Eromanga. This work will be completed by Christmas.

Pavement repairs are due for completion prior to Christmas at the Adavale end of the Quilpie Adavale Red Road (7101). These works are for a TMR reseal program.

Main Roads TIDS

Roughly half of the works will be sealed prior to Christmas. The gang utilized a stabilizer to mix in water to expedite the process time. The gang also worked on RDO's and Saturday. The gang will resume after the Christmas break to complete the works.



Flood Damage Repairs

The Concrete and Structures crew have completed two floodways on Canaway Downs Road (26). The work is fully funded Resilience funding from the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA).

Contractors continue throughout the Shire as per the attached map.

Roads to Recovery

Further reseals are due in the week commencing 7th December 2020. This includes the remainder of Sommerfield Road, parts of Kyabra Road (31) and Deacon Street in Eromanga, Jabiru Street (Buln Buln to Gyrica) and Cemetery road in Quilpie. Gravel resheet works will be done at Baldy Top Road (10.1) in the new calendar year.

COUNCIL BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES

Orders have been placed for the tennis courts refurbishments. Quilpie courts will be done in February 2021.

The kitchens at 43 Galah Street are complete.

Peter Donohue is constructing the garage at the new house in Galah Street.

WASTE

The contractor has completed removing scrap metal materials at the Quilpie Waste Facility.

The tender for the new garbage truck is a separate report for this month.

Council received yet another visit from Workplace Health and Safety inspectors following another public complaint.

WATER AND SEWERAGE

The new water main in Jabiru Street between Gyrica Street and Buln Buln Street is complete.

A donga has been installed at the depot to be set up as a water laboratory. The donga was sourced from the old depot.

TOWN SERVICES

The Town Maintenance Officer at Eromanga has resigned. Initially a local casual employee supplemented by Quilpie staff will continue maintenance.

Further vandalism of sprinklers occurred with 71 broken in one night. All information has been given to the police.

Works in Adavale will be carried out following an inspection by the Supervisor and Works Coordinator.


PLANT/WORKSHOP





National Disability Insurance Scheme

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Hon. Stuart Robert MP, Minister for the National Disability Insurance Scheme and Minister for Government Services released information during November regarding reforms to the way the NDIS will be delivered in 2021. There will be greater flexibility in how participants spend their funds on their disabilities and a big focus on improving early intervention for young children, increasing the age of ECEI from 7 to 9 years, which will give parents adequate time to pursue a definitive diagnosis particularly in rural and remote areas where paediatric supports have long waiting lists or are non-existent.

Now the Covid 19 virus has abated, most participants are utilising their plans well and there now seems to be a better understanding of the NDIS in the Quilpie Shire. This has led to more referrals in the last couple of months, particularly some children starting school next year. This will also be more streamlined when the new Local Area Coordinator commences in January and can travel out to Quilpie and meet participants face to face, as over the phone was not successful for some clients due of their disability. NDIS Toowoomba office were reluctant to use any of the web cam technology e.g. Zoom, Team Meeting due to confidentiality issues.

In the previous couple of months there has been miscommunication between some service providers, however this seems to have been resolved after consulting with them in regard to good communication and positive teamwork which will lead to a better life for participants.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SWRED Prospectus project: Lucid Economics have been engaged to deliver this project on behalf of SWRED. Visits to the region throughout the project, this will include opportunities for Council and community representatives to share in the development of the project.

The project milestones include a Research report, Resources and Inventory documentation, investment prospectus (one for the region and six individual documents) and Investment attraction program. Project completion: 30 June 2021.

<u>Business Development Group Meeting:</u> Business Development group meeting was held on Thursday 12 November 2020, over fifteen people attended. The discussion was positive and many actions came out of the meeting. These included confirmation of the Business Community Christmas Party and focus on Job promotion for local businesses. The next meeting will be end late February 2021 as an afternoon/evening meeting.

Queensland Symphony Orchestra (QSO): An invitation to livestream Beethoven Emperor from QPAC on Saturday 21 November was held successfully at The Lake. This was an opportunity to build a relationship with QSO. Images and feedback from the event were shared with QSO, it is expected this will continue to build future events.

The event was only livestreamed from four locations (Toowoomba, Mount Isa, Charters Towers and Quilpie). VIC staff are currently liaising with QSO about hosting future events in 2021.

Toowoomba Jobs Forum: Quilpie Shire Council participated in the Toowoomba Jobs forum hosted by RDA (South West and Darling Downs) on Tuesday 17 November. This was the first virtual jobs forum and a new opportunity to promote jobs in our Shire. Quilpie Shire had over ten jobs listed. Council also had a stand. Manager Tourism and Economic Development was available for any online chats. There was no direct enquiries to Quilpie, however the opportunity to collate positions vacant and gather further information to assist in strategies to attract people to the Shire was a positive outcome. Encouraging businesses to advise Council about jobs will continue. Staff are currently developing a jobs board on the Council page is expected to be available in early 2021.

<u>Tourism Development:</u> In further extension from the SWRED group package projects developed in 2020, consultant Anita Clark spent a week in Quilpie Shire with businesses. This also include a trip to Adavale and Eromanga. This project reviewed existing packages and reviewed changes for the 2022 season.

The visit also identified new products and opportunities, including specialized group packages that will be developed and released for the 2021 and 2022 season. The visit also provided support to the VIC team in building the marketing and product plan for 2021.

<u>Visitor Summary</u>: The official tourist season for Outback Queensland in generally considered between April and October, however because of COVID this extended to November. This resulted in the VIC experiencing our busiest November on record with an increase of at least 100 people compared to the last 5 years. These are just the numbers through the VIC, staff have identified a large number of Caravans passing through town that have not necessarily stopped at the Centre.

The overall VIC numbers for 2020 are 2196 down from our 2019 number of 10,131. Large events including the Big Red Bash and Birdsville Races were cancelled this year that number does not include the numbers of Visitors we would greet around these events. Combine that with VIC closures until June and lockdowns due to Covid-19, it really puts in to perspective how good 2020 numbers and the support for the region has received. It provides confidence that 2021 is anticipated to be our busiest year yet.

Gallery program 2020 & 2021

Our last exhibition for the year is currently in the Gallery, which is our annual Christmas in the Gallery. This year's display has been incredibly successful with 26 local creators selling their goods and so far over \$6000 dollars in sales with 3 weeks remaining for people to shop.

The VIC decided to have the opening of Christmas in the Gallery on a Saturday this year that proved to be very successful as we had over 90 people come through the display. We also feel having an extended opening from 9am-1pm was part of this success as those who work Saturday mornings were also able to attend. We will definitely consider a Saturday opening for 2021.
