BACKGROUND:

A Community Grant Application has been received from the Adavale Sports & Recreation Association requesting Council's consideration to provide financial assistance of \$8,500 toward Ambulance Services, COVID-19 compliance, Insurance and Entertainment at the 2021 Stockman's Challenge, Rodeo, Gymkhana and Bikekhana.

Their Community Grant Application was successful in 2020 however they had to cancel the event and did not receive the funds approved by Council. Other funds are usually sourced from previous events and sponsorship from local businesses, however as they were unable to hold these events last year these contributions were not received.

As per previous years Adavale Sport and Recreation Committee Inc. are seeking assistance from Council to obtain funds to help them pay for the mandatory requirements towards the event with the hope that they can attract more people to their tiny community and to help boost the morale of the locals from near and far after last year's traumatic events.

They are asking for more assistance so they can ensure they are COVID Safe which requires increased measures of cleaning, administration and monitoring this year and puts a lot more pressure on their very tiny committee. Adavale Sport and Recreation Inc. are also requesting assistance with the cost of Ambulance Services that are required on site for the three days of the event, assistance with the cost of the Public Liability insurance that is ever increasing each year and help toward the cost of entertainment by way of a DJ who will also assist them with sound for the weekend due to the committee not having any access to sound facilities.

As someone fortunate to live with a completely able body and without need of assistance, I have certainly taken my privileged life for granted at times.

Doing the Simpson Desert Trek in 2021 will give me a temporary snapshot of a life without all of the comforts I have come to rely on. In doing so, I will gain a greater understanding of the challenges of life for those thousands of young Australians who require high-needs assistance.

The trek will be both a physical and mental challenge, pushing me out of my comfort zone and requiring me to endure more than just mild discomfort. The challenge is just a small snippet into the daily struggle a young Aussie with high-care needs lives with.

On a personal level, a very good friend of my eldest sister was one of the first people to benefit from the work of Youngcare. Tim Martin was a vibrant young Queenslanders in his 20's, until he was found unconscious after a night on the town, left with severe disability. It's still not known what happened to 'Marto', but thankfully with the help of Youngcare, he is now able to live a relatively normal life, with appropriate assistance and care for his age and condition. I will be thinking of 'Marto' every step of my training and the 9-day trek.

I have already begun training 4-5 days per week, including gym training and hiking around Mt Coot-Tha, to ensure that I am physically ready for this challenge.

YOUNGCARE FAST FACTS

- As of July 2020, there are 5,113 people under 65 living in residential aged care
- NDIS Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) policy and pricing framework predicts 6% or 28,000 NDIS participants will be eligible for SDA
- Every week on average there are 42 admissions of young people into aged care – this number remains similar to the number of young people entering more than a decade ago
- Over the past 10 years (2008-2018) there was an average of 2,250 admissions per year
- A quarter of young people in residential aged care are parents to young children
