

From the CEO's Desk

Council are now in the final quarter of the financial year and we are looking ahead to the 2021/2022 budget. At the time of writing this, Council have held meetings in both Toompine and Adavale which were well attended and provided great feedback to Council on a variety of issues and potential projects. We have two more community meetings to come in Eromanga and Quilpie.

Council's Community Satisfaction Survey is still open until 1 May 2021, Council has seen an increase in responses as compared to the 2018 survey which is great. This feedback assists Council with identifying current and emerging issues within the Shire and supports Council's corporate strategy moving forward.

Residents should have now received their Land Valuations from the Department of Resources; the Shire and greater region have experienced significant increases within the Rural Land section. Council are proactively working to review each rating category to assess the impacts of the changes and adjust the general rates for the 2021/2022 period in response to these changes.

There have been a number of well attended events within the Shire including the Eromanga Rodeo & Campdraft, Toompine Gunshoot and Adavale Muster in the Mulga. I wish to commend the committees of these events from putting in your time and energy to ensure these events continue within the Shire. Council's own Visitor Information Centre has seen a significant increase in visitors with 423 through the doors as of 12 April, just to compare, the centre had 443 patrons for the whole of April 2019 – Pre COVID.

Council were activated by the Queensland Reconstruction Authority earlier this month; Council has commenced undertaking emergent works to rectify any major damage sustained during the weather event and have commenced the pickup of damage to restore the roads. The community can be assured that Council are working towards restoring the roads, however we must follow due process to ensure funding can be received to cover the repairs and they are not coming out of the ratepayer's pocket.

Council is aware of reports of vandalism occurring within the community, with several Council facilities being targeted and damaged sustained. We have a very proud community and take pride in the appearance and standard of our facilities. Any such unnecessary damage not only impacts on the appearance of the community but also results in unnecessary rate payer funds being spent to repair the damage. If any community members witness damage occurring, please report the incident to Council or the Police to ensure these matters can be recorded and addressed appropriately.

Finally, to help report maintenance issues throughout the Shire, Council is trailing the use of an app called 'Snap Send Solve'. When you're out in the community, you are the Councils eyes and ears. If you see something that doesn't look right, just Snap Send Solve it!

The full minutes of the Council meeting are usually available on Council's website the Tuesday or Wednesday following a Friday meeting.

Michelle will be in Quilpie on Wednesday, April 21st to meet with local small business owners by appointment.

"The service is guided by the small business owner and the situation they find themselves in," she said, "and I'd encourage people to contact me to make an appointment while I'm in town."

Funded by the Australian and Queensland governments, the SBFCSSQ initially examines a client's financial statements and analyses performance.

"I can assist with negotiations with lenders and creditors, preparing cash flows and budgets and developing payment plans and business options. The service offers an extensive referral service to Government support packages and helps with debt restructuring or refinancing.

"Together, we'll set goals and develop an action plan to get there but the decision is always made by the client."

As a small business owner herself, Michelle encouraged business owners to ask for help if finances were becoming strained.

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (also called the NDIS) is the new way of providing disability support.

The NDIS will provide all Australians under the age of 65 who have a permanent and significant disability with the reasonable and necessary supports they need to enjoy an ordinary life.

The NDIS will help people with disability achieve their goals. This may include greater independence,



As an insurance scheme, the NDIS takes a lifetime approach, investing in people with disability early to improve their outcomes later in life.

The NDIS also provides people with disability, their family and carers with information and referrals to existing support services in the community.

By 2019, the NDIS will support about 460,000 Australians with disability.









Can I access the NDIS?

To become an NDIS participant a person must:



Have a permanent disability that significantly affects their ability to take part in everyday activities;

Be aged less than 65 when they first enter the NDIS:

Be an Australian citizen or hold a permanent visa or a Protected Special Category visa; and



Live in Australia where the NDIS is available.

Can I still receive support if I do not meet the access requirements for the NDIS?

A person does not have to be an NDIS participant to receive support from the NDIS. The NDIS will connect people with disability, their families and carers, including people who are not NDIS participants, to disability and mainstream supports in their community.
