You are invited as a valued community member with knowledge of landscape and natural hazard behaviours to contribute to the story of resilience in the Shire and the Bulloo, Paroo and Cooper catchments. The QRA resilience team is engaging at a local level using a Big Map technique to understand flood and fire behaviours, local issues and to 'Walk the Landscape' of the region. This accumulated knowledge will be recorded and given back to the community as a ['Knowledge map'](#) (12MB) for the benefit of future residents, generation's and for emergency response.

[Resilient Queensland 2018-2021](#): Delivering the Queensland Strategy for Disaster Resilience (2018) is a whole-of-government response to disaster resilience that involves better coordination of government policy, information management, project delivery and stakeholder collaboration.

The Queensland Government is focused on strengthening disaster resilience so that communities are better equipped to deal with the increasing prevalence of natural disasters. A key outcome of Resilient Queensland is the development of regional resilience strategies to support prioritisation of resilience building projects across Queensland. By 2022, every
