

From the CEO's Desk

In the last newsletter I mentioned that Council's Community Satisfaction Survey had closed with 101 responses, the final report on the responses has been completed and is available on Councils website. It was pleasing to see that the community felt that Council generally does a good job in delivering services to the community. The past 12 months have provided a challenge like no other, with Council being able to continue to deliver services and also deliver upon a large capital works program supported by State and Federal Government Funding.

With only several weeks left in the 2021 Financial Year, Council are busy delivering over \$3 Million in funding due to be completed by 30 June. This funding has helped deliver the upgrades to the Toompine and Adavale Tennis Courts, sealing of Gyrica St, Bicentennial Carpark, Burt St and the Eromanga Town Hall Carpark in the last month alone. Council have also secured additional funding through the Works 4 Queensland 2021-24 program to construct 3 new dwellings in the next financial year, an additional \$615,000 through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Phase 2 program due to be delivered by 31 December 2021 and \$1.783M through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Phase 3 program due to commence on 1 January 2022.

The last Council meeting saw the adoption of a New Home Owner Grant initiative supported by the Quilpie Shire to provide a financial incentive for the construction of new residential dwellings. This Grant is intended to support, and does not replace, the support provided to new home buyers by other levels of government. Eligible applicants will be able to apply for the Quilpie Shire New Home Owner Grant. The Grant is paid per new home; not to each of the applicants for the same home. For further information, a copy of the policy will be available on Councils website, alternatively you can contact the Shire office for further details.

I have heard nothing but positive feedback from the Community with regards to recent events held within the Shire, including the Opera at Baldy Top which received national coverage on various television channels. The event was well attended with over 200 tickets sold, Queensland Opera were very appreciative of the Shire and the welcome they received. We look forward to working towards providing more events like this in the future. The event season just keeps rolling on with the sold out Outback Golf Masters teeing off on July 3-4, we will then see the cohort of Big Red Bash attendees travelling through the Shire and to finish it all of the Shire will hold the QRL clash between the Redcliffe Dolphins and Ipswich Jets on July 17.

The full minutes of the Council meeting are usually available on Council's website the Tuesday or Wednesday following a Friday meeting.

I am happy to meet with anyone who would like further information on any meeting outcomes.

Ordinary Council Meeting Wrap Up

11 June 2021

Community Assistance Grants were approved for:

• Quilpie Polocrosse Club for in-kind use of the Council tractor to assist in the preparation of playing fields at Bulloo Park and a cash donation of \$1,000 towards the cost of an Ambulance for the Annual Quilpie Polocrosse Carnival, and

 Quilpie and District Tennis Tour for a cash contribution of \$3,000 to assist in delivering tennis instruction across the Shire.

Council accepted the recommendation of the Local Government Remuneration and Discipline Tribunal, 2020.

Council resolved to contribute \$5,000 to a Regional Carbon Farming Study being sponsored by the South West Regional Organisation of Councils (SWROC), and to provide feedback regarding the Terms of Reference for the study. The total cost of the study is \$165,000.

Council resolved to offer the current lessee a Trustee Lease or Trustee Permit over the subject area in accordance with Section 57 of the Land Act 1994 and Policy PUX/901/210 – Leases over reserves over Lot 6 on TH21.

Council authorised the write-off of \$72,391.74 in the Civica Debtor System due to the transfer of ownership of a property into the name of Quilpie Shire Council.

Council provided no objection to the conversion of lands from Grazing Homestead Perpetual Leases to freehold tenure:

- Lot 2 on Crown Plan LO71 & Lot 8 Crown Plan LO75
- Lot 5 on LO72, Locality of Adavale
- Lot 1 on Crown Plan LO69, Locality of Adavale
- · Lot 5 on Crown Plan LO76, Locality of Adavale

Council approved the New Home Owner Grant Policy which provides a financial incentive for the construction of new residential dwellings in the Quilpie Shire Council Residential Development Areas of Quilpie, Eromanga, Adavale, Toompine and Cheepie.

WORKS UPDATES



Council's new garbage truck is under construction and will arrive in July. Once the truck arrives, the new transfer station will begin operation at the Quilpie waste centre. The retaining walls are complete for the new transfer station which will then be used to transfer waste to the tip face. This means that the public will be prohibited from aproaching the general waste trenches. Fencing is currently being erected to close off the rest of the dump area once the new process begins.



Works have been completed on the Toompine and Adavale Tennis Courts, just in time for the Quilpie District Tennis Tour on 8 - 10 July. The tennis workshops are being held at Toompine, Eromanga and Quilpie, delivered by Dean Stansell of Tennis Maranoa.

Workshops will be delivered in 2 sessions - 8 years and under, and 9 - 12 years (age flexible). All equipment is provided, no previous experience necessary. For more information contact Dean Stansell 0428 979 095. Do you know why Council runs a street sweeper? Quilpie is a flat town and soil which is deposited in the kerbing interferes with water drainage. Street sweeping is needed to keep the kerbing working properly and prevent runoff debris clogging up the drains.

Sweeping is also done to remove excess stones and dirt that drops off of vehicles. It also picks up litter such as grass clippings, cans and bottles, blown waste such as plastic bags, and anything else that is light in weight. The street sweeper means that out town can be kept neat and tidy and our drains aren't blocked.



Did you know that Quilpie Shire is the same size as Tasmania and has 2,755km of roads? This makes it very difficult for Council to know when roads get cut by flood waters or by fallen trees.

You can help by letting Council know when these things happen. This will help keep the community safe or will enable you to get to your destination quicker once the issue is resolved.





The Association was established on 11th August 1922 with Ruth Fairfax as the first State President. Big State Wide Centenary events are planned for our 100th in 2022.

Behind all the aprons, teapots and scones some very determined ladies established Queensland Bush Children's Health Scheme, Public Rural Crisis Funds, provided support for our servicemen, made birthing kits and stationery packs for poor countries. Opened aged care homes, student hostels, waiting mothers' hostels, baby clinics, bush nursing and petitioned to save the koalas. Supplied medical equipment for rural hospitals, advocated for farm safety and the Giddy Goanna program. Lobbied for seat belts in cars and road safety with the introduction of the audio "rumble" strips along road edges.

This is just a small sample of QCWA achievements, much more than tea and scones, although having a cuppa and a chat is when friendships are made!

CWA SCONE RECIPE

* Turn on the oven to 200 deg C INGREDIENTS

- * 3 cups of self-raising flour sifted
- * 1 good ½ to ¾ tsp of baking powder
- * Pinch of salt
- METHOD

* Half fill a cup of full cream milk and top up the other half a cup of cream — room temperature

* Pour the cream and milk and mix into the flour

- * Fold lightly with a knife
- * Tip onto a floured board
- * Knead lightly and cut or roll them out * Put in the oven in the next one from the middle
- * Take about 10-15 minutes



The National Disability Insurance Scheme (also called the NDIS) is the new way of providing disability support.

The NDIS will provide all Australians under the age of 65 who have a permanent and significant disability with the reasonable and necessary supports they need to enjoy an ordinary life.

The NDIS will help people with disability achieve their goals. This may include greater independence,



As an insurance scheme, the NDIS takes a lifetime approach, investing in people with disability early to improve their outcomes later in life.

The NDIS also provides people with disability, their family and carers with information and referrals to existing support services in the community.

By 2019, the NDIS will support about 460,000 Australians with disability.









Can I access the NDIS?

To become an NDIS participant a person must:



Have a permanent disability that significantly affects their ability to take part in everyday activities;

Be aged less than 65 when they first enter the NDIS;

Be an Australian citizen or hold a permanent visa or a Protected Special Category visa; and



Live in Australia where the NDIS is available.

Can I still receive support if I do not meet the access requirements for the NDIS?

A person does not have to be an NDIS participant to receive support from the NDIS. The NDIS will connect people with disability, their families and carers, including people who are not NDIS participants, to disability and mainstream supports in their community.


