COUNCIL COMMUNITY NEWS

I am sure that most people are growing very tired of the constant dialogue we are being fed on Covid. Those of us lucky enough to live in the bush have been somewhat shielded from the worst of the virus and lockdowns and all the ensuing consequences but we are all impacted, one way or another.

At least now, finally, the way forward is quite clear. The country will slowly open up when the vaccination rate gets to the 70% to 80% range. This should happen by late November but will vary depending on many factors. Surprise, surprise, but the states/communities with the most virus are getting vaccinated quicker. Australia may never get to 80% but a general view, that I subscribe to, is that once everyone has had the opportunity to get vaccinated we open up anyway. Not everyone wants to get vaccinated and that is their right but once you are vaccinated it doesn't really matter what others wish to do. I have been fully vaccinated for over a month now (with AstraZeneca) and it is a real comfort when you have had the second jab and that is coming from someone that doesn't get flu needles normally.

The latest figures I have seen is that 58% of the Quilpie Shire is fully vaccinated although our indigenous community is only at 26%.

Based on the figures coming out of NSW about 5% of people who get the virus get sick enough to go to hospital and about 1% end up in ICU and half of them may end up on a ventilator. People seem to forget that the vast majority of those that contract Covid don't get that sick and many don't realise they have it.

It's interesting to note, but not surprising, that there hasn't been any hospitalisations or deaths from normal seasonal influenza this year in Australia but there was over 1080 deaths from influenza in 2019 which is about average. On average 400 people die in Australia every day. 200,000 have died since the start of the pandemic and 1000 have died with Covid in that time. I think we need to keep some perspective in all this.

So based on all the facts we should expect to be opening up late this year and 2022 may see life getting back to normal. It is 100% certain that the virus will eventually move through the community but, if enough people are vaccinated, it won't have a huge effect. Yes, there will be people getting sick from Covid and some rare fatalities in those who are unvaccinated and have underlying health conditions but this is what always happens with viruses. Virtually all the people still getting sick or dying from Covid overseas are unvaccinated.

A recent business group meeting reinforced, once again, that housing and accommodation are the main issues confronting the shire at this time.

We are still hearing of people who would move out here if they could find somewhere to live. We also continually have discussions about possible events or business ventures that we could pursue but often come back to the problem of not having enough accommodation to facilitate the number of visitors that would be required to make the endeavour a success.

Council has decided to shelve the Wellspring project which was to happen on that site. In short, we couldn't find anyone, either a business or private individual, who was willing to come on board and help drive the project forward. The project was always going to require that impetus to really get going and it hasn't happened.

Also, the world has changed considerably since Wellspring was first proposed and many more opportunities are presenting themselves that weren't there three years ago. Having somewhere suitable to live seems to be the number one priority and that may prove to be the best usage for this important site. Council would welcome feedback on this plan.

As stated in my budget newsletter Council is planning to build two more houses in Quilpie this financial year and will be moving one in to Eromanga. We are also doing some preliminary investigation in to building a number of units/apartments at the old depot site. It is likely that there would be a reasonable demand for this type of accommodation from younger, pre-family people and professional workers in particular.

Hopefully, in the not too distant future, we can stop talking about Covid and start to focus on the many opportunities that the shire is now presented with. There could be exciting years ahead!

Ordinary Council Meeting Wrap UP

- Council accepted the tender of Austek Spray Seal Pty Ltd for the resealing and sealing of various shire roads Tender T01 21/22 Full Bitumen servicing works for \$867,277.07 incl GST.
- Council awarded the tender T02 21/22 FD 2021 - Screening 40,000m³ material to: APV Contracting Pty Ltd for a total of \$546,920.00 incl GST
- Council accepted the application from James Donohue to agist 35-40 head of mixed sex weaners on Warrabin Lane Reserve for an initial period of three (3) months, to be reviewed at the conclusion of the agistment period
- Council did not agree to enter into an agreement with Mr H V Byrne to lease Lot 39 NK84 for the purpose of keeping horses, as the paddock is to be retained for Shire purposes
- Cr Lyn Barnes was endorsed as an additional elected member of the South West Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils
- Council resolved to purchase by tender one (1) transportable home to be placed at 16 Donald Street Eromanga. The house will be purchased from Hoek Modular Homes at a cost of \$266,842.20 (incl GST)
- Council resolved to offer no objection to the conversion to freehold tenure of:
 - Industrial Lease No.0/218019 described as Lot 77 on SP1477938, locality of Quilpie;
 - Lease No. 0/232097 described as Lot 1276 on PH1540, Locality of Quilpie; and
 - Lease No. 0/232099 described as Lot 1315 on PH1615, Locality of Quilpie
- Council approved the request received from the Quilpie Motorcyclist Association for financial assistance of \$2,500 plus in-kind support for the supply of 15 wheelie bins, two tents, 100 chairs and generator to assist with the costs of facilitating the 2021 Motorbike Gymkhana and Enduro to be held on 25 and 26 September 2021.

WHAT IS THE PROGRAM

The Shop front refurbishment program was developed to support local business to improve the aesthetics and/or functionality of the shopfronts in Quilpie Shire. Council has resolved to fund a second round of the program for businesses (with shopfronts) located in the Shire.

The success of the round one of the Shopfront program in 2020 funded under the *Drought Communities Program Extension* and interest from business to continue has resulted in Round two of the program. Round one delivered over \$330,000 in improvements to business in the Quilpie Shire.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

A business or building owner who owns or runs a business in the Quilpie Shire, including the communities of Adavale, Toompine and Eromanga.

HOW IT WORKS

- ▶ Council will provide a 50% subsidy to the maximum value of \$10,000 for any one shopfront.
- ▶ The subsidy in one payment at the completion of works and submission of required documentation* before 30 June 2022.
- ▶ Applications not submitted by due date may not be considered.
- ▶ Only the external shopfront facing a street are eligible, not the entire building.
- ▶ Successful applicants will be required to enter into a contract with Council.
- ▶ *Documentation required includes copy of all invoices (paid) and demonstration of local procurement of goods and services. If unable to procure locally (4480 postcode) please provide a short explanation as to why i.e. specialised service.
- ▶ Applications will be assessed by Council on a merit based approach, however additional weighting will be to those businesses who have not previously received funding under this program.

Smart Farms Small Grants: Soil Extension Activities

Minister Littleproud would like to make you aware that applications are now open under the \$13 million Smart Farms Small Grants: Soil Extension Activities program.

Delivered under the National Landcare Program, and as part of the National Soil Strategy, which was launched in May this year, the applications for the program opened today, Tuesday, September 7, 2021, and will close at 9pm (AEST) on October 12, 2021.

Smart Farms Small Grants supports the adoption of best practices that improve the management and quality of our natural resources, while also increasing on-farm productivity and profitability.

This final round of Smart Farms Small Grants will provide the opportunity to help our farmers and land managers change the way they look at their soil and improve how they manage it.

Under this round, multiple activities may be applied for in the one application. Grants are available for between \$100,000 to \$250,000 per activity and will be delivered over two years. Applicants may apply for a maximum of \$2 million per application.

Funding is available to local government, land managers, farmers or organisations supporting land managers and farmers, as well as indigenous corporations. A full list of eligible entities is available in the program guidelines.

Eligible activities could include engaging a soil extension officer; conducting soil management workshops, seminars, roadshows or field days; creating communications products, webinars or online materials; and/or establishing trials, demonstrations and monitoring sites.

Extension Activities will seek to improve soil management, improving productivity and profitability. These measures will also support and complement the two-year National Soil Monitoring and Incentives Pilot Program which forms part of the National Soil Strategy.
