FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

The path out of COVID seems to be coming clearer although there are still some uncertainty about the next few months. As I indicated in my last newsletter, vaccinations are the key and it is very pleasing to note that the Quilpie Shire is one of the highest vaccinated shires in Queensland. As of the end of October we have 75% fully vaccinated and 85% have had at least one dose. This is the highest of the six shires in the South West Health region.

The Mayors of Queensland have regular teleconferences with the Premier and the Chief Health Officer and, at the last one a couple of weeks ago, the Premier actually mentioned Quilpie along with three other shires as being the highest vaccinated in the state with Goondiwindi being the highest. I feel this is very important because, as has just happened at Goondi, if we do get cases of COVID out here, we are much less likely to get shut down. Being shut down concerns me more than the actual virus.

Why? - Because by now only about 10% of people in the shire remain unvaccinated and, of those, only about 5% of those who get the virus will end up sick enough to go to hospital. Even if everyone in the shire got COVID there would be very few (if any) in hospital. Considering that hardly any of the outbreaks in Queensland have spread beyond the immediate households you would have to feel that it is not going to spread much out here anyway, especially in the summer. Next winter will probably be the real test but by then everyone will be able to access booster shots. Our indigenous community is still only at 50% vaccinated but SW Health is fully aware of this and clinics are planned to help increase the uptake, so I urge everyone to take advantage of those opportunities.

Many of you would be aware of the recent media about the Council's New Home Owner Grant which is to pay a grant equal to 5% of the value of a new home up to a maximum of \$12,500 to anyone who builds a new home in the shire. Most of the media outlets headlined the story as "Free land". This was because someone made the direct link between the grant of \$12,500 also being the amount that council had sold some blocks in Curlew Estate for recently. This was a "sale" price as a special "two for one" deal that council had done to try and get some of the blocks moving. They are valued at \$25,000 each and we agreed to sell two blocks for the price of one so, in effect, you were getting each block for \$12,500.



The grant has never been about free land and it has been frustrating to say the least to have to continually correct the media. You can't get the grant until you have purchased the land (if you don't already own some) and build or move a new house. Irrespective of this we have had amazing media coverage and nearly 400 direct inquiries and that is not counting the many from India after the story went viral over there.

We can't claim success until we get some land It is great to see some handy storms around the sales and/or houses built but it has certainly put shire and it bodes well for a wet summer. I sincerely hope that it will drive an increase in residential land sales and land values. I have been of the very firm opinion for many years that we need to see an increase in house values across the west to the point where it is attractive for people to build their own home, secure in the knowledge that they will get their money back or, ideally, a capital gain when they sell. The COVID induced disruption just may be the catalyst to really drive an increase in home values and, if so, right now may be the cheapest time to buy or build a home in the Shire!

It is great to see some handy storms around the shire and it bodes well for a wet summer. I know many properties are finally getting some decent stock numbers together and it would be an enormous benefit to have a good summer now to build on

Ordinary Council Meeting Wrap Up

The Unconfirmed Minutes of the Ordinary Council Meeting of Tuesday 9 November 2021 are available in full on Council's website: www.quilpie.qld.gov.au

- Council accepted the Quilpie Aerodrome Stage 1 Pavement Reconstruction Investigation Options Analysis, and agreed that the CEO should pursue funding options to implement the recommendations in the report
- · Tenders were accepted for:
- o Supply of an Isuzu NPR75 four wheel drive service truck from Black Truck and Ag, for a total price of \$156,980 excl GST, with a trade in of Unit 96 for \$54,545.46; and
- o Supply of a Crew Cab truck from Black Truck and Ag for a total price of \$\$190,339.99 excl GST, with CEO to arrange disposal of Unit 85 via auction
- The updated Footpath Master Plan was accepted for consideration of future footpath works in Quilpie
- Council approved the request from Quilpie State College for in-kind support for the supply of a water truck with a full tank of fresh water, and licensed operator, to be utilised at the annual Colour Fun Run
- Council approved to support the cost of travel for "All About Aquatics" to provide weekly swimming and aqua exercise in Eromanga during Term 4
- The request from Care Outreach to waiver facility hire fees for Eromanga Hall, Toompine Hall and Bulloo Park was approved, with permission for the team to stay overnight at each venue after the "Christmas for the Bush Bash" events
- RADF Round 1 funding applications were approved:
 - o Quilpie Cultural Society: workshops, Quilpie Shire Council: ArTour Western Touring Circuit Performances, and St Finbarr's School and Quilpie State College: Story Players Drama and Story Telling Workshop
- The Quilpie Christmas Lights Competition will take place this year, with categories and prize money as per the agenda
- Quilpie Shire Australia Day Award celebrations will be held on Friday 21 January 2022 at Bulloo Park
- Council did not accept an offer from S & H Cowley to purchase 2 lots in Shepherd Street Adavale for \$250 per lot, and authorised the CEO to negotiate a sale with the applicants
- Council confirmed the proposed date and times of Ordinary Meetings of Council for 2022
- Council approved the payment of \$65,562.20 (excl GST) to Outback Gondwana Foundation for the purchase and installation of a back-up generator
- Council accepted the tender submissions for the sale of council owned houses located at 58 Boonkai St and 64 Pegler St Quilpie at a price of \$70,000 each
- Council resolved not to accept Expressions of Interest received for the purchase of land at Curlew Estate, due to the
 high level of interest and multiple offers received for the same lots. Council then resolved to initiate an online auction
 process for Lots 5 & 6 on SP234966 and Lots 12, 13, 21, 22, 26, 27, 33 & 34 on SP234965 as Stage 1, with a
 maximum of 2 lots purchased by any individual/entity. CEO was authorised to set the reserve price and contractual
 arrangements
- Council resolved that the CEO provide views, requirements or objections relevant to future dealing of Term Leases on Lot 10 DP G0844025 and Lot 76 on SP 147938
- Council supported the Shop Front Refurbishment applications for businesses that have not previously received support under the program, to the value of \$63,644.58, and to increase the budget to reflect the additional support.

WHAT IS THE HOME OWNER GRANT

Quilpie Shire Council has developed this initiative to help new home owners to get their new home sooner. It is intended to augment and does not replace the support to home buyers offered by other levels of government,

This grant offers up to \$12,500 towards building your new home (Class 1a dwelling valued at less than \$750,000) and is paid per new home, not to each applicant for the same home. The grant applies to all township areas across Quilpie Shire -Adavale, Eromanga, Cheepie, Quilpie and Toompine.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

New home owners in the Quilpie Shire are eligible for the grant.

The home must be a new house that has never been occupied as a place of residence. It may also be available for new homes that have been moved from one site to another.

You must reside in the home for at least the first six months. and you must be an Australian Citizen or a Permanent Resident.

KEY INFORMATION

- The policy will cover new homes in Quilpie, Adavale, Eromanga, Toompine and Cheepie
- The grant is paid per home, not per applicant.
- This grant supports (but does not replace) what other levels of Government provide.
- Eligible applicants can apply for a one-off Grant of up to \$12,500 to offset expenses associated with building a NEW home in the Quilpie Shire.

NATIONAL ASBESTOS AWARENESS MONTH - NOVEMBER 2021

Quilpie Shire Council has been an ongoing registered participant in the National Asbestos Awareness Month campaign since 2016. Our last two Asbestos Awareness Month campaigns had 100% participation by all Australian councils.

Over the past two years many communities across Australia have been hit hard by the pandemic and sadly, to date at least 1500 Australians have lost their lives. However, within the same period more than 8,000 deaths from asbestos-related diseases were recorded including asbestosis and lung cancer with an alarming number of deaths from mesothelioma attributed to both occupational (tradies) and non-occupational (homeowners) exposure during residential renovations.

There is no doubt that we need to do more to increase awareness of the dangers of asbestos and with your help we can. I lost my grandfather to asbestos-related diseases and since 2013 I've been an Ambassador for National Asbestos Awareness Month because the more awareness the campaign can generate, the more lives that can be saved.

Now in its tenth year, Australia's longest-running, multiaward winning Asbestos Awareness campaign continues our mission of reducing asbestos-related diseases by warning Australians of the dangers of asbestos and directing them to the leading, most comprehensive, trusted asbestos information source, asbestosawareness.com.au.

The website has had more than 2.2 million pageviews, over 1 million sessions and hosts over 1500 downloadable resources (fact sheets, guides and handbooks, flyers and posters, graphics, images and AV) which have been accessed more than 500,000 times. The website also hosts Australia's most comprehensive online asbestos product database to help Australian's identify asbestos risks.

By directing your community to a wide range of free information and resources, we're helping them to identify and understand asbestos risks in homes and commercial and non-residential properties while providing resources specific to homeowners, renovators and to more than 23 specific trades. There are also a wide range of resources for rural and regional communities including Australia's first comprehensive guide to help landowners manage Naturally Occurring Asbestos (NOA) safely in line with government regulations.

Recently, concerns have been raised as to the risks people may be exposing themselves to when renovating. With Australia in the midst of a renovation boom, research found that 40% of DIYers who had worked on a property containing asbestos, only 5% knew of the high risks to health associated with asbestos compared to 22% being aware of the high risks associated with electricity.

As with electricity, asbestos fibres are invisible and can pose long-term and life-threatening health risks that can be related to the frequency and level of exposure - the higher the exposure, the greater the risk. However, even small amounts of exposure can lead to asbestos-related diseases which is why dealing unsafely with any amount of asbestos is likened to playing renovation roulette – there is no known safe level of exposure.

One of the greatest challenges we face as a community is that many believe that only fibro homes contain asbestos but this belief couldn't be further from the truth. Asbestos was used in the manufacture of more than 3000 building and decorator products used extensively in brick, weatherboard, clad homes and apartments built or renovated before 1990 and in commercial and non-residential properties before 2004.

Asbestos can be found lurking under floor coverings including carpets, linoleum and vinyl tiles, behind wall and floor tiles, in cement floors, internal and external walls, ceilings and ceiling space (insulation), eaves, garages, roofs, around hot water pipes, fences, home extensions, garages, outdoor toilets, backyard and farm structures, chook sheds and even dog kennels. It could be anywhere!

If undisturbed, well maintained and in a stable, sealed condition, these products are considered unlikely to pose health risks. However, just as electricity can be deadly, asbestos can be equally lethal when invisible fibres are disturbed and inhaled if asbestos is not managed safely during renovations, maintenance, removal or during the demolition of older properties. It also poses serious risks in abandoned buildings and in the environment if it's dumped or has deteriorated due to exposure to the elements.

Whether it's a home, a garage, or a commercial or non-residential property such as an office, shop, church or church hall, childcare or community centre, theatre, workshop, warehouse or even a farm shed; it's vital that property owners and tradies respect the fact that asbestos poses serious health risks.

With any home built or renovated prior to 1990 likely to contain asbestos (1 in every 3), Australians must stop playing renovation roulette and start to respect the invisible dangers of asbestos because it's not worth the risk!

Ways to Keep Your Pets Comfortable Over Summer

Our pets are more susceptible to temperature changes than us humans and when the mercury starts to rise above 30°C, owners can begin to see some real changes in their pets.


The classic symptoms of an overheating pet include;


- Excessive panting or difficulty breathing
- Drooling
- · Increased heart rate
- Increased respiratory rate
- Elevated body temperature
- Weakness or even collapse
- Seizures
- · Vomiting and bloody diarrhoea



- 1. Provide Plenty Of Water. Pets can become dehydrated very quickly, so make sure that they have access to plenty of fresh, clean water.
- 2. Provide Shelter From The Sun. If your pet is outdoors, make sure that they have a shady place where they can get out of the sun
- 3. Provide Cooling Aids.
- A small paddling pool for your dog
- Freeze large ice blocks for your dog to lick
- Cold, wet towels on the floor for your pets to lay on
- A wet towel draped over part of your pets cage, to help cool down the surrounding air/breeze.
- Freeze a bottle of water, wrap in a towel and put in the cage for rabbits and guinea pigs to lay up against.
- 4. Don't Leave Them In The Car

The temperature in a car can climb alarmingly fast. It may be a comfortable 24°C outside, but after 10 minutes the interior of the car is reaching 38°C and 50°C after just 30 minutes

These great friends, jump in wherever they can to help. They have dressed Tables and Chairs, hung balloons, put table decorations on, and then turn around the next day to help us put it all away.



Honey Soy Chicken Stir Fry

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook time: 15 minutes



1 1/2 serves per portion

Ingredients

400g rice noodles

1 tablespoon olive oil

400g chicken breast, skinless and cut into strips

1 onion, finely sliced

1 carrot, sliced diagonally 2 celery sticks, sliced diagonally

1/2 red capsicum, thinly sliced 1 bunch bok choy, roughly chopped

Sauce:

2 tablespoons reduced-salt soy sauce

2 teaspoons cornflour

1/2 cup vegetable stock

1 tablespoon honey 1 tablespoon sesame seeds

Method

PLACE noodles in large bowl, cover with boiling water for 1 minute, drain then refresh in cold

HEAT oil in a wok (or large pan), add chicken and cook for 5-10 minutes. Set aside. COOK onion, carrot, celery, and capsicum for 2 minutes.


RETURN chicken to the pan, add bok choy, and cook for 2 minutes.

MIX cornflour and soy sauce to make a paste, then add the vegetable stock (hot), honey and sesame seeds and pour over the chicken and vegetables.

COOK for a further 1-2 minutes until sauce thickens.

COMBINE the chicken and vegetables with noodles and serve.
