MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Well 2021 has certainly been an interesting year to say the least. Once again COVID has hovered over us all for a lot longer than we initially thought it would. The latest development will be the new vaccination mandate rules to be implemented on the 17th of this month. Council's position, and I believe this is generally reflected in the community, is that these measures will be almost impossible to police and will segregate our community. Of course, it is a state government directive and there is not a lot we can do about it but we have voiced our opposition to this and the concerns we share about these new restrictions on our way of life.

The Quilpie Shire is at 89% fully vaccinated and should be at well over 90% in a few weeks so this community is certainly not against vaccinations.

To put things in perspective, as I have been trying to do since this pandemic started, the reason unvaccinated people won't be able to go in to their local pub or coffee shop after the 17th is to restrict the spread of the virus when it eventually comes in. As I understand it, a vaccinated person with the virus is contagious for 5 days and an unvaccinated person is contagious for 7.5 days. Yes, the unvaccinated will spread it for longer but not hugely. Being vaccinated doesn't stop you having the virus and spreading it. Also the unvaccinated are more likely to get sick and will probably be at home while the vaccinated probably won't be very sick (if at all) and are more likely to be out in the community.

This was a great result and now we are hopeful that these blocks of land will see houses built on them over the next few years. If that happens and more people move here permanently to live then the whole process really will have been a success.

Throw in that 2021 was the best ever tourism season we have had with record visitor numbers and that we have had the best start to a wet season for many years and, all in all, it has been a pretty good year.

I would like to take the opportunity to wish everyone all the best for the festive season and hope that you can spend some quality time with friends and family.

Paul Michel (Pilot) and Alex Zollner Deputy CEO, Angel Flight visited Quilpie recently to meet with Council's CEO Justin Hancock and Mayor Stuart Mackenzie, to receive a cheque for \$14,438.17 donated this year from fund raising activities by Council Staff and Councillors. Since Council staff began their fund raising initiative in 2015, they have donated \$30,607.07 to this worthy charity which coordinates non-emergency flights to assist country people to access specialist medical treatment.

A cheque for \$14,438.17 was also presented to Jenny Hewson and Philippa Ware who operate the local charity Friends In Isolation, to help them continue to help Quilpie Shire people who find themselves in need of assistance during times when they are ill, and in need. This brings the total donated by Quilpie Shire Council staff and councillors to \$40,057.27.

Engineering Services Works Update







Sealing of the widened shoulders on all three sections of the Quilpie-Charleville Road has now been completed.

A total of 9.34 km has been widened.

Eight culverts are now completed to assist with drainage of the road.

Final sealing to be completed by 12 December.

We've had some very welcome rain in the Shire during the past few weeks - rain gauges recording anywhere between 10 and 85 mls depending on the whim of nature!

This, together with generous rains falling in the north, has meant that we have had more than our share of road closures.

While the upkeep and maintenance of roads is Council's responsibility, you can assist by staying off unsealed roads for at least 48 hours after rain. The damage that occurs by driving on wet roads lasts for many months until Council contractors or staff can work on the road.

By staying home, we can keep the roads in good condition, potentially not cause damage to your vehicle, and potentially not have the embarrassment of getting badly bogged.

Council formally closes the roads after reasonable rainfall and as such if you drive on the road you are breaking the law!



REX Wins new Queensland Regulated Route

Rex announced on November 21 2021 that it had won a competitive tender to service the Central 1 Route which connects the communities of Roma and Charleville to Brisbane. The Central 1 route is one of 7 regulated routes put out for tender in July this year by the Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) and is currently serviced by QantasLink.

Additionally, Rex has been re-awarded the 5 regulated routes that it is currently servicing. The 5 regulated routes are:

- Northern 1 Route from Townsville to Winton to Longreach and return;
- Northern 2 Route from Townsville to Hughenden to Richmond to Julia Creek to Mount Isa and return;
- Gulf Route from Cairns to Normanton to Mornington Island to Burketown to Doomadgee to Mount Isa and return;
- Western 1 Route from Brisbane to Toowoomba (Wellcamp) to St George to Cunnamulla to Thargomindah and return; and
- Western 2 Route from Brisbane to Toowoomba (Wellcamp) to Charleville to Quilpie to Windorah to Birdsville to Bedourie to Boulia to Mount Isa and return.
 The new contracts commence on 1 January 2022 for a period of 5 years.
 At this time the schedule / frequency of flights

is still to be announced.

COVID MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

The latest Vaccination Mandate rules due to come in on the 17th December regarding business owners are causing a lot of concern in our community. Council's position is that we do not support them and believe it will cause enormous segregation in our community and will be almost impossible to police.

We are very mindful of our limited policing resources across the shire and those four police have already been under pressure due to assisting on border closures etc.

I know that individual businesses are concerned about their position come the 17th and I only can quote a letter from the Deputy Premier that I have been forwarded in response to the Local Government Association of Queensland submission to the government on behalf of all councils:

I quote: "I confirm that enforcement of any mandates is a matter for the Queensland Police Service. Business owners, for example, are not expected to assume this role and neither are local government authorities."

Council is very mindful of the difficult position you have been placed in but I do reiterate - it is not your responsibility! We are also very mindful of our police's position and do not wish to see them burdened any more than they already are!

WHAT IS THE HOME OWNER GRANT

Quilpie Shire Council has developed this initiative to help new home owners to get their new home sooner. It is intended to augment and does not replace the support to home buyers offered by other levels of government,

This grant offers up to \$12,500 towards building your new home (Class 1a dwelling valued at less than \$750,000) and is paid per new home, not to each applicant for the same home. The grant applies to all township areas across Quilpie Shire -Adavale, Eromanga, Cheepie, Quilpie and Toompine.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

New home owners in the Quilpie Shire are eligible for the grant.

The home must be a new house that has never been occupied as a place of residence. It may also be available for new homes that have been moved from one site to another.

You must reside in the home for at least the first six months. and you must be an Australian Citizen or a Permanent Resident.

KEY INFORMATION



The policy will cover new homes in Quilpie, Adavale, Eromanga, Toompine and Cheepie

- The grant is paid per home, not per applicant.
- This grant supports (but does not replace) what other levels of Government provide.

Eligible applicants can apply for a one-off Grant of up to \$12,500 to offset expenses associated with building a NEW home in the Quilpie Shire.

All other dwellings must transition to full compliance by 2027. Don't leave it to the last minute. You could save a life.



Planning Your Holidays? Remember Your Pets!

The holiday season is almost upon us, but for those with pets there are a few extra things to organise before you can go away: who will be taking care of your furry friends? Boarding kennels are a good option; your pets will be safely confined and have regular attention. Your pet will require up-to-date vaccinations to stay at commercial boarding facilities.

Unfortunately, most kennels require advance bookings for the busy Christmas-season with most booked out by August. Keep this in mind if you need to make lastminute plans. Also, boarding kennels might not be suitable if your pet is easily stressed by other animals or strange environments. If you decide to leave your pets at home, and don't have a trusted friend or neighbour to help, a pet-sitting service might be appropriate.

The pet-sitter would visit your house daily to provide food, company and enrichment. Some pets are stressed by changes in their routine so it's important to keep an eye on them to ensure they are eating, drinking, toileting and are otherwise okay in your absence. Still, you might prefer to holiday with your pets. There are lots of hotels, home-stays and camping sites that are pet-friendly and can be easily found online. However, you might need to book in advance. If your lucky pup is holidaying with you, there are still a few extra things to plan.

Make sure that your dog's vaccinations, worming and flea treatment is up to date. You might also need to arrange paralysis tick prevention, depending on your destination. Don't forget to pack their leash, food, doggy bags, and water bowls. If your pet takes any prescription medication take enough to last the holiday. Also, make sure your pet is safe while travelling in your car. Use an appropriate restraint, such as a harness or a crate. Your pet should be able to sit or lie down in a natural position while restrained. Never leave your dog unattended in a car. Dogs can die very guickly from heat stress, even in mild weather. Whether you are leaving or taking your pets with you, ensure your pets are microchipped and your contact details are correct on the microchip register so you can be contacted if need be. There are six microchip registers across Australia, so make sure the one your pets are recorded on is recognised nationally. Also, attach an ID tag with your contact details to your

pet's collar. For more advice contact the RSPCA.

Minister Littleproud would like to make you aware of a new Federal Government funding program which has opened recently.

The Future Drought Fund Drought Resilient Soils and Landscapes Grants Program, opened on December 1, is a competitive grants process to promote and demonstrate land management practices that support drought resilience.

Minister Littleproud is confident that there are many land management practices that can help farms stay productive during, and recover quicker after, drought, and he wants to help bring these practices into the mainstream eg maintaining strong groundcover helps the soil absorb and hold more water for longer, and protects it from erosion and weeds.

The Federal Government wants to show that such practices can be effectively applied at a broad scale, and are looking for projects that fit this bill. These projects will provide demonstrations that farmers can learn and take confidence from, and apply on their own farm.

Applications close for this program on January 11, 2022, and more details, including guidelines, can be found at Future Drought Fund: Drought Resilient Soils and Landscapes Grants Program | Community Grants Hub

The Outback Gondwana Foundation has secured \$5,300 through the latest round of Community Heritage Grants, for a Preservation Needs Assessment of the Eromanga Natural History Museum Geoscience Collection.

The Outback Gondwana Foundation will use its second grant to bring a trained conservator to the Eromanga Natural History Museum, where staff and volunteers work to uncover and preserve mega and micro fauna from one of Australia's richest palaeontological sites.

"The Museum showcases the incredible diversity of Outback Australia's natural history and visitors get to experience displays from the tiniest fossils the size of a sugar grain to the mightiest dinosaurs Australia has ever seen," Mr Littleproud said.

The Community Heritage Grants program supports a wide range of organisations, particularly small, volunteer managed community groups, who otherwise would have no access to qualified heritage practitioners and very limited funding to appropriately care for their collections.

The Quilpie Club will receive \$11,985 towards installation of solar panels at the Club from the 'Powering Communities Program. Energy bills are often one of the biggest overheads for not-for-profit organisations," Mr Littleproud said.

"Whether it be a sports club, a community kindergarten or a community radio station, by helping to reduce power bills, the grants will ease the financial pressure these organisations face, so they can better focus on meeting the needs of their local communities."

Mr Littleproud acknowledged the valuable role of these social hubs in communities.

"We recognise many have done it tough during COVID-19 and this program will help them to do what they do best, which is serve and support the community."

Turkey and Mango Salad

Serves: 6 Prep time: 15 minutes Cook time: 5-10 minutes

1 serve per portion

Ingredients ½ cup sunflower and pumpkin seeds ¼ cup dijon mustard 1 tablespoon honey ¼ cup apple cider vinegar ¼ cup apple cider vinegar ¼ cup olive oil ½ teaspoon black pepper 5 cups baby spinach 200g cherry tomatoes, halved ½ red onion, thinly sliced 500g cooked turkey breast, sliced or shaved 1 large mango, sliced ½ cup dried cranberries

Method

HEAT a frypan over medium heat. Dry toast the sunflower and pumpkin seeds for 5 minutes or until golden. Set aside to cool.

COMBINE mustard, honey, vinegar, olive oil and pepper in a small jug to make the dressing. COMBINE baby spinach, tomatoes and red onion in large salad bowl.

SPRINKLE turkey meat, mango, cranberries and seeds on top of salad vegetables. DRIZZLE a small amount of dressing on salad and serve with remainder in small jug.

It must be Christmas!

It's a crazy, busy, but hopefully joyful time of year, whether you join in the celebrations or not. Most of us usually eat too much, perhaps drink too much.....and mum has made plum pudding - so what can we do? 1. De-stress - take a deep breath, slowly in through your nose and out through your mouth, with your eyes closed if possible. POLICE NEWS:

ROAD SAFETY:



With the upcoming Xmas / New Year period we can expect an increase in traffic enforcement and Random Breath Testing patrols from both local and visiting officers. Disappointingly the other day I detected a local vehicle travelling at @150km/h coming off the Wanko Flat near the Napoleon Road turnoff. Travelling at that speed on our roads is inviting tragedy and not worth the time saved. I'm sure the person involved could have done without the \$1286 fine, losing eight demerit points and receiving a six month driver's license suspension from the Department of Transport and Main Roads. All open roads within Quilpie Shire (except for built up areas / roadworks etc) are 100km/h – not 110 or 120km/h.

It is also important to ensure you have your seatbelt on when driving your vehicle both in town and on the open roads. You literally have no chance of avoiding serious injury / death if you have traffic crash on an open highway and you are not wearing your seatbelt.

Police will focus on the Fatal Five major causes of Injury Traffic Crashes - SPEEDING, DRINK & DRUG DRIVING, SEATBELTS, DRIVER FATIGUE and DRIVER INATTENTION & DISTRACTION (Using your Phone whilst Driving). Avoid these and you will avoid an accident.

PROPERTY SECURITY:

For those of you who are lucky enough to be heading away for the Christmas Holidays please ensure that that your property / house / vehicles are secured. We are pretty lucky in Quilpie that property crime is rare. That said we may have visitors coming to town over the Christmas / New Year period that may be inclined to take advantage of a lack of property security. Let your neighbours know if you will be away and they may be able to keep an eye on your place. LOCK IT or LOSE IT.

MOTORBIKES AROUND TOWN:

With the end of the school year we will most likely see an increase in kids on motorbikes. Motorbikes should not be ridden on the roads in town. Sensible riding will not draw the attention of local officers. However if you are tearing down the street, kicking up dust or making noise around houses or the hospital where the night shift staff are trying to sleep you will draw our attention. The Police Powers & Responsibilities Act (Motorbike Noise) provides Police with the ability to impound motorcycles where they are causing a nuisance. If you are advised by Police or a member of the public you and your bike are causing a problem please heed the advice and take it away from the edge of town. There is a big town common for you to ride on.
