Quilpie Visitor Information Centre (VIC) recently showed its true colours at the Queensland Tourism Awards - and it's gold all the way!

Deputy Mayor, Cr Roger Volz and Senior Tourism Officer, Jess Tully, accepted the award on behalf of Council and the VIC at a presentation held in Brisbane on 15 November.

The awards event brought together over 1,000 tourism operators, event organisers and industry advocates from across the state.

The Quilpie VIC won over some very tough competition, taking home the top award in the Visitor Information Category.

The win automatically sends them to the Australian Tourism Awards being held in Adelaide in March 2025, where they will vie for the national VIC award.

Mayor's Message

As we come closer to the end of another year, the pace of business for the council is at a breakneck speed; finalising the housing project, wrapping up roadworks and reconfiguring our advocacy directive as we usher in a new State Government. I appreciate the enormity of the task and my commendation goes out to all of our staff who make the everyday things a reality for the Shire communities.

On 21 October, Cr Volz, Cr Barnes, Cr Lander and I attended the LGAQ Annual Conference in Brisbane. At this conference we voted on motions put forward by all councils in Queensland to advocate for change at state and federal government levels.

Quilpie Shire Council put forward a motion for an increase of the subsidy for flights on regional airlines, making flights cheaper for all residents of remote areas. This was supported by all, and the LGAQ will now begin lobbying the state government to make it happen.

This will assist people with reaching specialist medical appointments and boarding school student fares, among many other reasons. It will also increase the liveability of rural remote communities across Queensland, not just here in Quilpie Shire.

We heard presentations from many other local government leaders about projects that they had successfully brought to fruition, and this gave us valuable takeaways on the framework of how these were achieved. We can bring these concepts back for our community and apply to a wide range of Council activities, from public infrastructure, innovations and economic development.

We were also able to develop personal relationships with those who lead the projects and use their knowledge as a resource.

A delegation of Cr Barnes, CEO Justin Hancock and I presented to Federal Ministers in



Canberra on 18/19 November. Our presentation was a lobby piece to gather support from relevant Ministers for our current application under the Growing Regions Grant program.

This application supports the completion of the third and final stage of the Eromanga Natural History Museum. Getting this across the line will have significant outcomes in advancing the global brand of Quilpie Shire Tourism.

I recently attended the Seniors' Luncheon held at the Brick, and while unfortunately the walls didn't talk and spill any secrets on the seniors or their pasts, it was a fun-filled event and well supported.

Thank you to Michelle Donohue for all she does in this space. We appreciate having our seniors among us every day, in a community where it's safe, supportive, and comfortable to age.

Schools are soon wrapping up for the year and we have a mailbox full of engagements for all to attend the various breakups and awards nights. I really look forward to the kids' performances and hearing principals reflect on the year that was. I encourage everyone to come and show their support at these events.

Cooper also had some adventures looking around Parliament House.












Quilpie Gets Ready for 2025

Current disaster management information can be found on our <u>Disaster Dashboard</u>, at the top of our website homepage.



Council Meeting Catch Up

29 OCTOBER 2024 COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Community and cultural news

- Council accepted an invitation from Southern Queensland Regional Arts Services to partner on the production of *Under the Southern Sky,* Arts and Culture of Southern Queensland, a publication to showcase the artists and creatives living and working in the Quilpie Shire. \$2,500 approved.
- The 2024 Quilpie Shire Christmas Lights competition categories and prizes were approved and will be promoted throughout the region. The competition includes four regional sections, each with their own categories and prizes. Details and nominations forms are available on the website and at our administration centre.

Corporate and Governance update

- Councillors nominated the 2023/2024 Quilpie Shire Council Annual Report for entry to the Australasian Reporting Awards - General Award for local government.
- Council supported a funding application under the Safer Local Roads and Infrastructure Program for flood proofing Napolean Road. The application nominates a total project cost of \$3.7M, with a budgeted co-contribution of \$750K from Quilpie Shire Council.
- Grant Daniel and Long Pty Ltd trading as Nutrien Harcourts GDL were approved to conduct an online auction of replaced and redundant Plant and Equipment.

Engineering Equipment

Council will purchase equipment as shown below as part of its fleet replacement program for 2024-2025:

- Two variable message signs
- a flail mower attachment
- second-hand street sweeper unit

Road names approved

The formal naming of two previously unnamed gazetted roads and their inclusion in Council's Road Register was approved. These include:

- the road reserve known as Seco Crossing was formally designated as Seco Crossing Road;
- the road reserve known as Adavale Bore Road was formally designated as Adavale Bore Road;
- the new road leading into Toompine Transfer Station and new bore site was formally designated as Toompine Bore Road;
- the road reserve known as Eromanga Dump Road was formally designated as Eromanga Dump Road.

SPECIAL MEETING HELD 12 NOVEMBER - HIGHLIGHTS

Pre-approved suppliers approved

Thirteen suppliers of mobile plant and equipment for wet and dry hire were approved for inclusion on a list of pre-qualified suppliers for road and civil construction works for 12 months, with an option to extend for a further 12 months.

The full list of successful tenderers can be found in the minutes of that meeting.

Sale of land approved

Council formally accept offers, including special conditions, for the sale of 63 Dukumarra Street (Lot 15 on SP234965) and 88 Sommerfield Road (Lot 20 on SP234965) for \$25,000 per property from the Department of Housing and Public Works.

Corporate and Governance update

- Councillors resolved to waive fees for building applications for Class 10a shipping container, and QSC footing plans until 30 June 2025.
- An inspection program under the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008 will be carried out in Quilpie and Eromanga from 1 February for a period of six months.

Council has awarded the following tenders:

- Southwest Ford for the supply of a single cab 2WD ute under RFQM 07 24-25
- Construction Equipment Australian for the supply of a 2024 Rubber Tracked Mini Excavator and Trailer under RFQM 08 24-24

Community and Cultural News

- Eromanga District Rodeo Association Incorporated will receive a financial contribution of up to \$50,000 for works associated with the installation of a new septic system to assist with the construction of a new ablution block at Eromanga Rodeo Grounds.
- Council will meet with representatives of Young Guns to discuss the potential of working collaboratively to deliver the Potential First Pathways Initiative within the Quilpie Shire.







Engineering Works Update

Council's road crews have been busy over the past month and have now completed the following works:

- Sealing of Adavale Transfer Station and Patricia Park Road
- Sealing of Adavale Black Road
- Sealing Toompine Bore Road, Toompine Transfer Station and Reseal at Toompine
- Shoulder grading on Quilpie -Windorah Road
- Earthworks at Eromanga Transfer Station

Crews have now commenced work on sealing the final section of the Quilpie - Adavale Red Road.

Grader Crews are working on the Quilpie - Charleville Road.

Residents can also assist by lodging a customer request to report road damage. Customer requests can be lodged by phone, in person, in writing, by email or via Council's website.
