## Mayor's Message

July marked another busy month with Council locking down it's budget and framing the plan for the year ahead.

There's an extraordinary amount of work to be done and I have every confidence in our teams delivering these projects. As they progress through these works, I ask the community to assist with patience and understanding of any inconvenience that may arise. The end goal, after all, is a better Shire for us all.

An open-ended review of the Dingo Barrier Fence began at a meeting held with landowners and the State Government review panel at the Council Chambers on 25 July. This review aims to form an understanding of the fences efficacy and produce a recommendation to the State Government as to the commercial viability of the fence.

With overwhelming consensus of the room in support of the fence, Council will be strongly advocating for its continuance. I encourage all to take the time to contribute to this conversation and assist where you can by lobbying for your own position on this matter.

Between 7 and 14 July we celebrated NAIDOC Week across the Shire. This reflective and respectful series of events was an absolute credit to the collaboration of the people who pulled it together. I was fortunate enough to make it to the opening ceremony at Quilpie State College and witness the first of the week-long activities. Unfortunately, rain had ruined the master plan of being by the river, but we'll always take the rain.

Next stop for me was Eromanga State School, where I witnessed the kids play games and participate in aboriginal language and craft workshops. The kids were amazing, taking in all the cultural sharing they could get and really reflecting on its message.

### Mayor's message

As the first budget of the new term of Council, the 2024-25 Budget has focused on the delivery of strategic infrastructure projects while balancing cost increases to our day to day operations. While the average residential rate payer in the township of Quilpie will see an increase of \$3.26 per week for General Rates and Utility Charges, Council is still heavily reliant on State and Federal Grants with 60% of Council's operational revenue generated through grants.

Maintaining good quality infrastructure has been a focus of Council for many years and this philosophy has not changed with significant investments in road, water and sewerage infrastructure programmed for the 2024-25 and proceeding budgets.

Council has received additional Capital Grant funding starting in 2024-25 through the Works 4 Queensland and Roads 2 Recovery programs. These increases will help fund upgrades to floodways (\$2.124M), Adavale water main replacement (\$260K), Bob Young memorial park upgrade (\$450k) and more.

Council's investment in liveability continues with the finalisation of the houses and town houses (\$5.18M), along with refurbishing the Eromanga pool (\$600k) and constructing a new walking path from Quilpie town to Baldy Top (\$300k).

The Councillors and I would like to thank Council officers in working diligently to deliver this budget and implement the projects throughout our Shire.





## July Council Meeting Wrap Up

- Council agreed to submit a funding application under the 2024-2028 Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program for the development of Quilpie Airport to ensure the long term viability of the runway for RFDS aircraft and regular passenger transport.
- Subject to funding approval, Council resolved to award RFQL 18 23-24 Flood Restoration Works 2022 - September Flood Damage-Adavale Pkg to APV Contracting Pty Ltd for an amount of \$614,733.36.
- Council approved the following Community Assistance Grant applications:
  - Quilpie Sporting Clays Club for \$1000 direct cash contribution and in-kind support toward their 2024 annual two day shoot in August
  - Quilpie Gold Club for \$2000 direct cash contribution and in kind support toward the Quilpie Open Golf weekend in August
- Council approved the provision of Supporter Sponsorship to the value \$500 to the QCWA Annual Report and State Conference
- Council has advised the Channel Country
   Ladies Day event organisers of its commitment
   in principle to support their 2024 events, with
   the level of support to be considered on
   receipt of a formal request.
- Council appointed Julie Reitano as Acting Chief Executive Officer from Monday 19 August 2024 to Monday 14 October 2024.
- Council agreed to support an application for the Eromanga Natural History Museum - Stage 3 under the Growing Regions Program with a financial cash contribution up to \$3,000,000
- Council resolved to accept an offer from Alina Graham for the sale of 64 Pegler Street Quilpie for the amount of \$145,000

- Council resolved to advise the Department of Resources that Council was not opposed to removal of a creek name that could be considered offensive under the Place Names Act 1994, and requesting input into the renaming of the creek
- Council agreed to support an application for the Quilpie Sewerage Treatment Plant Replacement application under the 2024-28 Local Government Grants and Subsidies Program (LGGSP).
- The renewal of a lease on lot 51 on NK86 due to expire 1 December 2025 was approved
- Council accepted an offer to purchase two lots of land at Adavale from Aaron Lankowski, being Lots 503 and 504 on A2451 for \$1500 ea
- Following a recent Expression of Interest for Audit Committee Members, Council approved the following appointments effective 1 August 2024 to 31 July 2028:
  - Ms Mel Jacobs, Mr Ian Stacey, Ms Kerri Mooring and Mr James Gauvin as independent members
  - Cr Ben Hall and Cr Roger Volz as Councillor representatives
- A new Construction of Road for Access to Property Policy was adopted by Council
- Council approved a DA for Reconfiguring Lot 1 on SP277802 into 30 rural residential lots, two park lots and road reserves, subject to specified conditions
- Council approved minor changes to planning and building fees and Council facilities fees under the Register of Cost-Recovery Fees and Commercial Charges, effective 16 July 2024

# Engineering Works Update

- The last two Hoek homes were delivered in early July, one in Boobook Place and another in Dukamurra Street.
- Works have commenced on fitting out the houses with fencing, sheds and service connections.
- Construction crews are back at the Grey Range undertaking Stage 2 of road widening at the intersection of the Cooper Developmental Road.
- Maintenance crews have been carrying out shoulder grading along the Diamantina Developmental Road East of Quilpie.
- Crews have now commenced work on an all weather access to the new Toompine Transfer Station. This is located adjacent to the new water bore on the eastern side of the highway.
- Concrete crew and Parks are undertaking upgrade works at the front of the administration building, works involved removing trees, and repairing damaged footpaths.
- Murweh Shire's jetpatcher has been carrying out edge repairs along the Diamantina Developmental Road.
- Parks crews have been busy assisting with the Outback Masters Golf.
- We have seen an increase in vandalism around Quilpie, including graffiti and damage to sprinklers in the centre islands; if you know anything about this please report it to the Police.
- Flood Damage works around Eromanga have been completed.
- Contractors have now moved to Adavale area.

Quilpie State College provided an amazing rotation of traditional group activities and johnny cakes, kangaroo, emu and crocodile were stars of the lunch menu!


Mulga Mates Centre celebrated NAIDOC Week with a special guest - Mardigan man, Wayne Martin.

St Finbarr's School hosted the closing ceremony on Friday 12 July. Welcome to Country was performed by Wayne Martin and Douglas Collins and a moving Mindful Reflection and Acknowledgement, focusing on connection to country and each other was led by Principal, Kara Marsh.

During the day, ochre painting and grinding stones (assisted by Aunty Ruby), building gunyahs and traditional games were part of the days program of activities. Mayor Ben Hall officially closed the NAIDOC Week celebrations.

These NAIDOC Week celebrations were a great success thanks to strong support of the Quilpie Shire Council, Quilpie NAIDOC Committee, NIAA, CWAATSICH, Deadly Choices, Cunnamulla Primary Health Care Centre, RESQ, Quilpie State College, Eromanga State School, St Finbarr's School and the community.









## The Care Collective - SW Primary Care Pilot

Partnering with the local community to improve the health and wellbeing of those living with complex health conditions.

#### THE PROJECT

The Care Collective - South West Primary Care Pilot aims to improve how Queenslanders in the South West region access care by building on the strengths and fixing health service gaps in these communities.

Funded by the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care, the project is focused on health service providers working together to develop models of care that meet the needs of the community.

## WHAT IS IMPORTANT FOR THE PROJECT TO BE SUCCESSFUL?

- Understanding the local area's services, programs and providers.
- Taking a holistic approach to complex and chronic health conditions.
- Clearly communicating with health and community services to ensure timely and appropriate referrals.

## SUPPORTING THE FAR SOUTH WEST QUEENSLAND REGION

When talking with health providers, consumers and other stakeholders, it was identified that many people living in far south western Queensland find it hard to access primary health care services and their care is not always coordinated. This project aims to work on these issues in the following centres:

- Charleville
- Quilpie
- Cunnamulla
- Thargomindah and surrounding areas.

The project will be evaluated in the middle of 2025 to see if it can be rolled out across other parts of Queensland.

#### BENEFITS FOR THE COMMUNITY

- Person-centred and culturally safe health care for consumers, closer to home where possible.
- Improved communication between health care providers and services.
- Better coordinated access to health, community and social support services for the community.
- Stronger health literacy in the community.
- Better management of health conditions with personal care plans and supports in place.
- Fewer avoidable hospitalisations and trips to the emergency department.

#### **GROWING OUR TEAM**

Local knowledge and the right skills are important to support the health and well-being of Queenslanders.

Our project team members work and live in the areas they support, which means we can grow and change our workforce based on local needs. These team members work with local councils, primary care providers and First Nations health organisations.

The dedicated Care Collective workforce may be different across areas depending on the local needs. There are three different options that each area picked from, with some areas choosing multiple:

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE COORDINATOR**

These Coordinators provide administrative project support for all primary and community health care service providers to make sure health and wellbeing services in each area are coordinated.

#### **CLINICAL CARE COORDINATOR**

These qualified health professionals provide clinical care coordination to consumers in the primary care setting, in partnership with General Practitioners, community and acute health care providers.

## Housing help for Queenslanders

## Housing Finance Loan for remote and regional Queenslanders

Are you eligible for the Queensland Housing Finance Loan Regional trial?

The Queensland Government is helping more Queenslanders living in country areas into home ownership so they can stay close to their families, jobs and community connections.

The Queensland Housing Finance Loan is for people who can afford to buy or build a home but are unable to get a loan through a bank or building society.

The Queensland Government has extended the household income eligibility of the existing Queensland Housing Finance Loan from \$141,000 to \$201,000 per annum for a two-year trial, allowing more people in regional Queensland to apply for the loan

This trial is open to eligible people living in 45 local council areas including:

Balonne, Banana, Barcaldine, Barcoo, Blackall-Tambo, Boulia, Bulloo, Burke, Burdekin, Carpentaria, Cassowary Coast, CentralHighlands, Charters Towers, Cloncurry, Cook, Croydon, Diamantina, Douglas, Etheridge, Flinders, Gladstone, Goondiwindi, Gympie, Hinchinbrook, Isaac, Livingstone, Lockyer Valley, Longreach, McKinlay, Maranoa, Mareeba, Mount Isa, Murweh, North Burnett, Paroo, Quilpie, Richmond, Scenic Rim,

Somerset, South Burnett, Southern Downs, Tablelands, Western Downs, Whitsunday, Winton.

#### Renters Relief Package

This expanded eligibility means that income limits have increased so more Queenslanders can access renting assistance.






